



## **Manfred Celebration August 1, 2010**

A celebration held August 1, 2010 for Manfred was greatly enjoyed by everyone with a program, displays, afternoon lunch and a time of fellowship at Festival Hall on the Wells County Fairgrounds in Fessenden followed by an open house in historic Manfred. A grant for this event was provided by Sons of Norway International. Many thanks to all the people who helped to make this such a lovely and successful event! Coordinator - Pam Norstedt, preparation and printing of program - Audrey Solheim, sound system - Perry Anderson.

The program began by honoring the *Fagerlund Sons of Norway Lodge* of Manfred on its 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with lodge president, Peter Anderson, giving the welcome. The singers and dancers from the *Sverdrup Sons of Norway Lodge* of Bismarck dressed in their festive Norwegian bunad attire, delighted the audience with their performances narrated by Audrey Solheim. Pam Norstedt gave a very interesting history of the lodge. She introduced the current members of Fagerlund Lodge who are: Donald Anderson, Peter and Rose Anderson, Peg Bell, Verna Bowers, Gordon Christenson, Helen Fritchie, Gwyn Herman, Laura Johnson, Laverne Johnson, Richard and Wanda Melchert, Art Melby, Pam Norstedt, Harley and Muriel Weros. Sons of Norway Representative, Ann Krause, brought greetings.

The song "Wildflower" sung by Laverne Johnson and Gwyn Herman was greatly enjoyed, as well as "The Manfred Song" written and performed by Laverne. Laverne gave a delightful presentation on the history of Manfred School in celebration of the 100<sup>th</sup> year of the big brick Manfred School. It was a special honor to have former Manfred School teachers Laverne Johnson, Marlys Boese Piatz, and Betty Ellingson Reichenberger in attendance, as well as a number of former students. The Manfred School and Hotel Johnson /Fagerlund Sons of Norway Hall buildings were dedicated into the *Manfred Heritage Museum*, and Wanda Melchert gave a brief talk in celebration of the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of *MHP*, *Inc*. After the program, an afternoon lunch of sandwiches and salads was provided by *Friends of Bowdon Store* with a freewill donation. Also cake, goodies, coffee and punch were served by Fagerlund Lodge. The Wells County Museum was opened for viewing of artifacts such as the miniature Viking Ship built for Fagerlund Lodge and the medical bag of Dr. Peter Boyum, who served as Manfred's first doctor.

Following the afternoon activities, everyone was invited to an open house of historic Manfred. A number of projects have been completed in Manfred during the past year. A matching grant awarded by the State Historical Society of North Dakota to MHP, Inc. made possible exhibit panels created and installed by volunteers in the 1903 Melby Rogness House. Contributions from friends of Manfred, along with grants awarded by the State Historical Society of North Dakota, Preservation North Dakota and North Dakota Telephone Company to *Rural Vestige Alliance* helped fund the roofing project of the 1910 Manfred School and the 1899 Rogne/Soderback/Solheim House with contractor Charles Bolin. A matching grant awarded by Preservation North Dakota to *Melby Heritage Society* helped fund the construction of a boardwalk for the 1906 Hotel Johnson with contractor Greg Seidel.

Other recent projects include the painting of the 1906 Vang Lutheran Church by contractor Rita Seidel and the painting by volunteers of the 1906 Hotel Johnson to appear as it traditionally had looked. Interestingly, the hotel building later served as the Fagerlund Sons of Norway Hall for many years. Electrical connections to the two garages on the Melby Rogness property were installed by contractor Fritz Wohl. New sidewalk for the Melby-Rogness property has also been completed by contractor Rodney Opdahl. Wow! The restoration of historic Manfred and the gathering of history for Manfred is progressing wonderfully well with the wonderful help of local volunteers and contributors from across the USA!

## 1916-1917 School Year (Continued)

#### Wells County Free Press News Entries

#### October 12, 1916

Manfred School is now having a splendid sewing class. The sewing done this past month has been mostly in finishing up the garments for the sewing contest. The boys in the intermediate department and the grammar department began last Friday with the manual training work, and are going to continue throughout the winter.

#### **December 7, 1916**

The prizes in the spelling contest for the past month were awarded to fourth grade-Agnes Langseth; fifth grade-Lila Nelson; sixth grade-Esther Soderback. The younger girls in the sewing class are embroidering linen towels. Tillie Fiebick of Manfred School received the first prize in the sewing contest.

#### March 15, 1917

A "hard time" basket social was given last Friday night in Melby's hall by the school for the benefit of the commencement exercises which will take place the latter part of June. A large crowd attended and the occasion furnished a fund of about \$38.00.

#### May 10, 1917

The 8th grade final examinations will be held on Thursday and Friday, May 24th and 25th, 1917. Applicants are required to furnish pen, ink, and legal cap paper. Paper will not be furnished from this office. Applicants please report promptly at 8:30 o'clock, A.M. Testing: Thursday A.M.-Arithmetic, Physiology. Thursday P.M.-Agriculture, Civics, Spelling. Friday A.M.-Geography, Reading. Friday P.M.-Grammar, History. Sennev Nertrost, County Superintendent

#### May 31, 1917

Eighth grade commencement exercises for Manfred School will be held at the Melby hall tonight, May 31, at 8:30. The program is as follows: Piano solo, Miss Luella Hammer. Address, Prof. A. G. Crane. Class history, Tillie Fiebick. Class prophecy, Margaret Rudie. Presentation of diplomas, Supt. Sennev Nertrost. Vocal solo, Mrs. Roy Owen. Benediction, Rev. J. M. Langseth.
