The projects included wall and ceiling repair, sanding and refinishing floors, reinstalling wainscoting and molding as needed, and painting the east classroom, hallway, and entry. The west classroom had been completed in time for the Manfred Pioneer Festival – 2018. A school grand opening was held during the Manfred Pioneer Festival – 2019, in celebration of completing this project.

The Manfred School Window Restoration Project was launched during the Manfred Pioneer Festival – 2019. Intern Lindsey English had taken note that 2019 was the 125th Anniversary of Manfred, from when the Manfred Post Office was opened in 1894. After estimating the material and labor expense of restoring one window, the cost of each window came very close to \$125.00!

Joe and Ida Strauss Family History

Joe and Ida were each born on farms near Harvey, Joe in 1904 and Ida in 1908. They grew to adulthood on these farms and attended nearby schools. On December 26, 1927, Joe and Ida were married in Harvey and settled there for a time before moving to the Strauss family farm south of Harvey. Their first three children were born in the hospital at Harvey: 1Kathryn 1928, 2Donald 1930, and 3James 1931. Children born to them on the Strauss farm were: 4Elaine 1932, 5Lucille 1933, 6Arlene 1935, 7Audrey 1937, and 8Joseph 1938. Their son, 9Richard was born in the hospital at Harvey in 1941.



In April of 1942, Joe and Ida and family moved to a farm east of Manfred together with Joe's brother, Arthur 'Art.' Though the house on their new farm was very small, they made do. As reported in the Manfred News of the April 2, 1942 issue of the Wells County Free Press, "Art Strauss and Mr. and Mrs. Joe Strauss are moving to their farm this week recently occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Karl Ehni." Art left in October of that year for Ft. Snelling where he entered military service.

Joe and Ida's final children were born in the Harvey hospital: **10**Judy in 1943 and **11**John in February of 1945. In July of 1945, Joe and Ida had the Burkum house in Manfred moved to their farm, located one mile east of Manfred. This house provided much more space for the family. Joe's brother, Art joined them in August of that year, following his discharge from the service.

With the Strauss family's move to a farm near Manfred, Joe and Ida's children attended the school in Manfred. Joe, together with his brother, Art continued farming together. In addition to farming, Art managed an elevator in Manfred.

Important to Joe and Ida was enjoying time to gather with family and friends. In 1950, Joe served as the census taker in the Manfred area. Here follows a fun May 11, 1950 news entry for Joe: "The Manfred county paper reporters had a very thrilling experience on May 7th while they were gathering the weekly news. Joe Strauss was in town with his horse-drawn sleigh and gave us a ride, which was very unusual for this time of the year." Joe and Ida's daughter, Arlene, recalls riding to school sometimes in a horse-drawn sleigh.

In about 1955, Joe and Ida moved from the farm into Fessenden. Joe's brother, Art, at 70 years young, married Pat Sanders Arneson. In 1990, Joe and Ida moved to Harvey. Joe became a resident of the St. Aloisius Nursing Home and Ida lived nearby in an Assisted Living Apartment. In 1993, Ida joined Joe in the St. Aloisius Nursing Home. Joe died June 7, 1997 in the Harvey St. Aloisius Medical Center and Ida died there April 14, 2003.

At the time of Ida's passing, she had 39 grandchildren, 87 great-grandchildren, and 12 great-great-grandchildren. The funeral services for Joe and Ida were each held in St. Augustine Catholic Church, Fessenden, with internment in Hillside Cemetery of Fessenden.

Kathryn "Katie" Strauss was born in 1928 at Harvey, North Dakota. She spent her youth on the Strauss family farm south of Harvey and completed her primary education at a nearby rural school. In 1942, her family moved to a farm east of Manfred. Kathryn graduated from Harvey High School in 1946.

In 1947, Kathryn married Ordean Gladheim, born in 1926 to Ole and Clara Gladheim* also of rural Manfred. Kathryn and Ordean first lived at Hamberg where Ordean worked in the elevator. Their first two children, Linda and Daryl, were born while they lived at Hamberg. The family then moved to Butte, North Dakota where their children Diane and Marla were born. They lived there for several years and later moved to Vancouver, Washington. Ordean passed away at Vancouver in 2003. Kathryn continues to live at Vancouver near many of her family.

2 DONALD 'Don'

Donald "Don" A. Strauss was born in 1930 at Harvey. He began his schooling south of Harvey and continued at Manfred School where he graduated from the 8th grade in 1944. Don helped his father with the farming and also worked at an elevator in Manfred where his uncle, Art was the manager. In 1953, Don married Shirley Johnson in Bowdon. Don worked at various jobs before taking over the family farm near Manfred. Their children received their education at both Manfred School and Fessenden School. Don and Shirley received the honor of the Soil Conservation Award in 1976. In that same year, the family moved to Kaukauna, Wisconsin where Don served as a farm assessor.

After retirement, Don moved to Billings, Montana, married Muriel Knodel and worked at a golf course. After divorcing Muriel, he moved to Mesa, Arizona where he served as a security guard part-time. He enjoyed gardening, softball, the New York Yankees, the Green Bay Packers, and dancing. In December 2013 with rapidly declining health, Don moved back to Brillion so his family could help take care of him. He stayed with his daughter Debbie. Don died June 11, 2014 at Brillion, Wisconsin. Shirley, died July 21, 2019 at Brillion.

James "Jim" F. Strauss was born in the hospital at Harvey, North Dakota in 1931. His early years were spent on the Strauss farm south of Harvey where he began his schooling. He continued his studies at Manfred School after his parents settled on a farm east of Manfred.

A March 22, 1945 news entry in the Wells County Free Press about James and his brother Donald follows; "Under the direction of Perry Anderson, the Manfred Agricultural 4-H Club has begun its sixth year of work with 12 boys. Officers and members of this club are: Harley Rogelstad, president; Gene Melby, vice president; Donald Anderson, secretary and treasurer; and Roger Flick, Allan Flick, Donald Strauss, James Strauss, Kenneth Elton, Edward Ravnaas, Joe Holzer, Dale Opdahl and Gerald Froeber." James and his sister Elaine being only about a year apart in age, were in the same grade in school. Both graduated from 8th Grade at Manfred School in 1946 and then from Fessenden High School in 1950.

In November of 1950, James enlisted in the United State Air Force serving until 1954. After his discharge, he returned to the Fessenden area where he was employed for a short time by the Wells County Agriculture Stabilization and Conservation Service, before moving to Omaha, Nebraska later that year where he worked as a counselor at Boys Town. Later, he worked at St. Joseph's Hospital in Omaha as a business administrator. In 1977, he moved to Irving, Texas and was employed by Uniroyal Company until his passing on June 11, 1986 in Irving at age 55. The service was held at St. Augustine Catholic Church in Fessenden with burial in Hillside Cemetery near Fessenden.

Elaine Elenore Strauss was born in 1932 at the Strauss farm south **4 ELAINE** of Harvey. She began her schooling south of Harvey, and continued at Manfred School beginning in the 4th grade. In 1944 with Jennie Lloyd as teacher of the Upper Grades room, a production was presented as noted in the April 6th issue of the Wells County Free Press: "Manfred School to Present Operetta — On Friday, April 14, the Manfred public school will present an operetta, 'The King's Sneezes' at 8 o'clock p.m. A good deal of preparation has been put on this production, and it promises to be excellent entertainment for the people of the community. Featured in the operetta are Wesley Boese, Verna Anderson, Ethel Melby, James Strauss, Wayne Hustoft, Kenneth Elton, Donald Strauss and Elaine Strauss."

Elaine graduated from Fessenden High School in 1950 and then attended Minot State Teacher's College for one year. She taught in West Norway Township during the school year 1951-1952 and at Chaseley for the school year 1952-1953. On August 11, 1953, Elaine married Arthur Weigelt at St. Augustine Catholic Church in Fessenden, North Dakota. They made their home on the Weigelt farmstead where they raised their children. Elaine died May 3, 2010. Services were held at St. Augustine Catholic Church with burial at Hillside Cemetery near Fessenden. Arthur continues to live on the farm.

In 1952 she was married to Maynard Wahl in Fessenden where they made their home. In addition to raising her six children, Lou worked at the Pioneer Bar, which she and Maynard owned. She later worked as a waitress at the Cabaret for many years. Maynard died in 2003. Lou died

Arlene Strauss was born in 1935 on the Strauss family farm south of Harvey. When her parents moved to a farm near Manfred, Arlene began her schooling there. Arlene graduated from 8th Grade in 1949 at Manfred School and from Fessenden High School in 1953. That year, she was married to Ellery Ehni and initially they lived with his parents, John and Ann Ehni, on their farm south of Manfred. In 1958, they moved to a farm north of Manfred where Ellery continued to farm. The first three children, Cindy, Skeet, and Kim attended Manfred School. In 1963, the three children switched to the Fessenden school. In 1969, Ellery and Arlene bought a farmstead and land on the west edge of Manfred. Their son, Skeet, continues to farm that land today. In 1974, Ellery and Arlene purchased a home in Fessenden and moved the family into town. The children all attended Fessenden School. Ellery died in 2012. Arlene has lived in Devils Lake and Fargo, and presently lives in Bismarck.

Audrey Strauss was born in 1937 on a farm south of Harvey, North Dakota. She had her schooling in Manfred with the following teachers: Mrs. Hans Peterson for Grade 1, Myrtle Mortenson for Grades 2-4, and Lorraine Roland Jenny for Grades 5-7. While in the 7th grade, a February 23, 1950

Manfred News entry in the Wells County Free Press included the following: "Audrey Strauss and Marlys Boese went to Fessenden Friday with Mr. and Mrs. Perry Anderson. They helped serve coffee and doughnuts for the 4-H clubs at the Winter Show. Due to the storm they had to remain in Fessenden overnight." Audrey was one of the winners in the essay contest for which she received a certificate and prize money. Her 8th grade teacher was Myron Stroh. She graduated from the 8th Grade at Manfred School in 1951 and from Fessenden High School in 1955.

Audrey graduated in nursing at Minot in 1959. She began her career as a registered nurse at St. Joseph's Hospital. She also worked at the John Moses Veteran's Hospital and the hospital on the Minot Air Force Base. In 1965, she married James D. Larson. They had one child, Michelle. Michelle married Ted Bagley in 1986 and they moved to Portland, Oregon and had one child, Thomas.

James died in 2008 in Minot. Audrey lived in Minot until 2010, at which time she moved to Portland to be closer to her daughter.
